I was born and raised in a church planter's home in Kalamazoo, Michigan. Because of my parents' (Kent and Julie York) influence on my life from the very beginning, there hasn't been a period in my entire life that I have not been involved in a church setting. I had heard the Gospel many times very early in life and I remember asking my mom one morning when I was 5 years old what it meant to be saved. She promptly opened the Bible and began to show me from Romans and John what I must do to be saved, but it wasn't until that evening while attending the Wednesday prayer meeting that the Spirit of God convicted me of a need to be saved. It was in October of 1986 that my father knelt with me and showed me the Romans Road again. I carefully read the verses and knew what my life truly deserved but also understood that God had given me a precious gift of life eternal through Jesus Christ. I called upon the Lord to save me and He did. He has forever changed my eternity. I followed in believer's baptism a couple weeks later on a Sunday morning.

Growing up, my parents instilled in us to always be serving in some capacity in a local church. We don't just sit around in a church; we are the church, and we are ambassadors of the Gospel and we are to be doing the work of the ministry. I have tried to fulfill this everywhere that I have lived.

Eleven years later at Lake Texoma Baptist Youth camp, surrendered to full-time ministry. We had a missionary in one of the morning sessions that was preaching on surrendering to the Lord's call of ministry. I remember kneeling at the old camp altar and asking God that if He would have me, I would be a willing vessel for Him to use.

I met my wife, Brooke, as a counselor at Lake Texoma Baptist Youth camp in 2001. We began dating later that year and we were married on June 28, 2003. She has had the same mindset when it comes to being a servant of God. She is always willing to serve in whatever capacity she is needed. We have developed the slogan in our house and in the ministries we have been involved in of "faithful and flexible." Faithful to the Lord in all things and flexible to adjust when He changes our plans.

When I was 8 years of age, I went to a church camp in Texas called Lake Texoma Baptist Youth Camp. At the end of each service, the speaker encouraged us to come down to the front to pray. My friend Randy asked if I would go down and pray with her. Before this moment, I had never had any kind of spiritual experience, or realization. I knew that people were getting saved, but that never translated to my own personal need for Christ. Well, that all changed! When we began walking down the aisle, the Holy Spirit began convicting me that I needed something more. Our pastor's wife, Mrs. Lona, was waiting for us at the altar and she began showing Randy in God's Word how much Jesus loved her, how He died on the cross to pay for her sins, and how He became alive again. She continued to show her in Romans how we were all sinners and that if we truly believed in our heart that Jesus really did everything that the Bible said He did, then we just needed to pray and ask Him to save us.

In that moment, I was able to witness a life-changing experience for Randy and for myself, because Randy received Christ. Having heard all of this, I finally understood exactly what I needed to do, and that was to call on Jesus. So, I also prayed and received Christ that day. I followed Jesus in obedience and was baptized shortly after at Temple Baptist Church in Springdale, Arkansas.

For many years after that moment, I thought salvation was the end goal. I was never taught that I needed to dive into God's Word so I could grow closer to Him. Well, I had another Spirit-led opportunity that changed the direction of my life. I agreed to do a Bible study with my youth pastor's wife and the Holy Spirit showed me in the Bible the truth of discipleship, how to grow closer to Jesus and how to begin teaching and telling others what I had learned. Since that time, nothing has been the same.

The Lord gave me an opportunity to serve at the same youth camp as a counselor when I graduated high school. It was during one of

the invitation times again that I knew God was calling me into the ministry. He had been convicting me for 2 years straight to be obedient to Him and surrender; however, I had my own plans and dreams. It wasn't until that night when I finally surrendered to His will. I made a decision to go into full-time ministry public with my church, friends, and family.

Solomon is 8 years old and a very smart and energetic boy. He loves to fold paper airplanes, origami animals and can solve various Rubiks cubes(he's currently working on solving the 5x5). He asked Jesus to save him at the age of 5 and was baptized shortly thereafter at Bible Baptist Church in Gulfport, Mississippi.

Thomas is 5 years old and also energetic. He loves to do Kids' exercises and is learning to read and how to write in cursive. He is a professional popcorn and snack eater. We have to keep both eyes on him at all times.




Ann Arbor is an affluent area and as the rich man in Luke 12, his love for money blinded him to any existence of God much less a desire to meet with Him.


